Mayors Report

I am excited to report that on June 8, 2021 the Drinking Water Board authorized a loan of \$2,178,000 for 30 years at a 1.0% interest with \$870,000 in Principal Forgiveness for a total repayable amount of \$1,308,000 to Bicknell Town. The next step in the process of getting a new well is for an environmental impact study. I am very hopeful that our new well will be completed by next summer.

I go on July 1st to meet with CIB to hopefully get funds for our road project.

The Town Council voted at the June Town Council meeting to raise the park rental fee from \$25 to \$50. They also voted to raise Business License fees from \$25 to \$50.

Save Water

- **3 gallons per day:** saved if you turn off the tap while brushing your teeth.
- **5 gallons:** saved by cutting a shower short by 2 minutes.
- **17 gallons:** saved if shower is off except for getting wet and rinsing.
- **150 gallons:** saved each time someone sweeps instead of using a hose to clean sidewalks and driveways.
- **25 gallons:** saved if watering is done before 8 a.m.
- **33 percent:** average water savings if lawn is replaced with drought-adapted plants.
