It seems some of the bigger boys gave matches to the smaller boys and told them that on Christmas Eve when Santa Claus came in his red suit and trimmings to strike a match and set fire to the cotton on his suit. I believe Harve Mangum was the boy that struck the match and set fire to the cotton on Santy Claus. Of course, the cotton caught fire and Santa Claus kind of went up in smoke. They put out the fire and pulled off the suit and I guess pretty much spoiled the Christmas Eve program, but her it was 60 or 70 years later and my Mother and my aunt thought it was quite funny."

Water Conservation Tips:

- **Keep a jug of drinking water in the refrigerator:** This ends the wasteful practice of running tap water to cool it off for drinking.
- **Plant drought-resistant trees and plants:** There are many beautiful trees and plants that thrive in Utah with far less watering than other species.
- **Put a layer of mulch around trees and plants:** A layer of mulch will slow the evaporation of moisture.
- **Use a broom to clean driveways, sidewalks, and steps:** Using a hose to push around a few leaves and scraps of paper can waste hundreds and hundreds of gallons of water.
- **Water during the cool parts of the day:** Less water is lost to evaporation when the ground and air are cool. Early mornings are better than at dusk since it helps prevent the growth of fungus.
