Mayors Report

Rhett Jackson has moved out of Bicknell limits and will no longer be able to serve on Town Council. The Town Council and I would like to thank him for his time and service he has given. We appreciate everything he has done for the town.

Applications for Planning & Zoning and Town Council were due on April 26, 2021. We will be voting on these applicants at our May 6, 2021 Town Council meeting.

Back in January, I let you know that we were working with Sunrise Engineering to get a grant/loan for road maintenance on several roads throughout the town. The estimated cost for this project is \$979,000 and the application is due June 1, 2021. We hope to get funding in October 2021 and start the project the spring/summer of 2022. There is a map at the Town Hall showing what roads are included in this project. The town hall is open every Tuesday and Thursday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm if you would like to come look at it. We also will be having a Public Hearing regarding this project on May 6, 2021 at 6:30. I encourage all to attend.

If you are wishing to file as a candidate for Bicknell Town Mayor or Council Members, you need to be between June 1, 2021 and June 7, 2021 from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. These are the positions that are up for election: Mayor – 4 year term, Council Member – 4 year term (2 positions), and Council Member – 2 year term.

Water Conservation Tips:

- **Don't water the gutter:** Adjust your sprinkler patterns in such a way that water lands on your lawn or garden, not on concrete or asphalt, where it does no good. Avoid watering on windy days when much of your water may be carried off before it ever hits the ground.
- **Check for leaks in pipes, hoses, faucets, and couplings:** Leaks outside the house may not seem unbearable since they don't mess up the floor or drive you crazy at night. But they can be just as wasteful as leaks in the line from the water meter, even more wasteful. Excess watering and leaks around foundations can cause subsidence and damage walls.
