Water Conservation Tips:

- **Use your dishwasher only for full loads:** Every time you run your dishwasher; you use about 25 gallons of water.
- **If you wash dishes by hand, don't leave the water running:** If you have two sinks, fill one with soapy water and one with rinse water.
- **Install water-saving showerheads or flow restrictors:** Most showerheads put out five to ten gallons of water each minute, while three gallons is enough for a refreshing shower.
- **Don't let the faucet run while you clean vegetables:** You can serve the same purpose by putting a stopper in the sink and filling the sink with clean water.
